
CSE 397 Issues in Cybersecurity



With ever-increasing reports of sophisticated attacks on computer systems, cybersecurity has become an important concern for consumers, businesses, and governments. In this 2-credit seminar course, we will examine a range of technological, legal, and social issues in cybersecurity. Most readings will be drawn from current media as cybersecurity incidents and responses are taking place.

Class participation will constitute a significant portion of the grade for this seminar course. Students will take responsibility for proposing many of the topics and readings. There will also be a mid-term essay and a final paper or project.
